Know Your Rights for Employers

- Before ICE comes:**
- 1. Make a written response plan.** Give the plan to workers and managers so everyone knows what to do. Practice the plan!
 - 2. Connect with an immigration lawyer.** Give workers a list of lawyers or organizations that can provide free or low-cost immigration legal advice.
 - 3. Connect with an immigration response network.** Know what others are doing in your area.
 - 4. Train the workers.** Make sure they know their rights, and best practices.
 --Do NOT run away. Running away could give ICE a legal reason to arrest workers.
 --Do NOT give ICE agents permission to enter the workplace.
 --Do NOT answer questions or provide any information.
 - 5. Post an "employees only" sign.** The workplace is private property. Under the 4th Amendment, law enforcement does not have the right to enter **without a warrant signed by a judge.**

Know Your Rights for Individuals

- 3. You can stay silent.** The 5th Amendment protects the right to remain silent and not incriminate yourself.
- 4. You do not have to share personal information.** You are not legally obligated to provide information like your immigration status, place of birth, or criminal history. Anything you say or do can be used against you. You should not lie.
- 5. You do not have to sign anything or hand over documents.** You are not legally obligated to sign any document without speaking to an attorney.
- 6. You have the right to speak with an attorney.**

How to Document ICE

- Size:** How many agents are there? What do they look like? What are they wearing?
- Action:** What are they doing? What was said? Where did they come from? Which direction did they go in when they left? If they detained someone, what was their name and contact information?
- Location:** Where did the action take place?
- Uniforms:** What agency are they with? Look for identifying badges and labels such as: DHS, ICE, CBP, ERO, ATF...
- Time and Date:** When did the incident happen?
- Equipment/Weapons:** Did they have weapons? What kind? What kind of car? Licence plate number?






HOW TO FOLD AN 8-PAGE ONE SHEET ZINE




push in the ends

like a diamond




flatten the diamond



PRIVATE PROPERTY - ENTRY RESTRICTED BY LAW

NOTICE TO ALL LAW ENFORCEMENT & IMMIGRATION AGENTS

- ▶ This is a private workplace. You are not permitted to enter non-public areas of this business (including offices, breakrooms, storage areas, and staff only areas) without a judicial warrant signed by a federal judge or magistrate.
- ▶ An ICE administrative warrant (Form I-200 or I-205 does not authorize entry into private areas of this business.
- ▶ You may not question employees or search the premises without proper legal authority.
- ▶ All employees and visitors have the right to remain silent and the right to an attorney.



IF YOU ATTEMPT TO ENTER THIS PROPERTY WITHOUT A VALID JUDICIAL WARRANT, YOU WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE.



IF YOU PRESENT A JUDICIAL WARRANT, PLEASE NOTIFY MANAGEMENT AND LEGAL COUNSEL IMMEDIATELY BEFORE PROCEEDING.



IF YOU ENTER, YOU ARE TRESPASSING, AND WE WILL SEEK LEGAL RECOURSE.
